CHARGED PARTICLES TRIBUTE TO JAZZ VIRTUOSO MICHAEL BRECKER

Kick Off Event for Jewish Experience Lunch and Learn Series 2018-2019

September 13 @ 10:30 am - 2:30 pm

The SYJCC's Jewish Experience Lunch and Learn Series is opening its series with the celebration of Brecker the man and the musician. The lecture and concert is a collaboration between the 26-year-old Bay Area jazz trio, Charged Particles (drummer Jon Krosnick, bassist Aaron Germain, and pianist Murray Low), and their special guest tenor saxophonist Tod Dickow. Dickow is a devotee of Brecker, has captured Brecker's sound amazingly well on his instrument, and has transcribed a wide array of Brecker's most enjoyable and challenging compositions.

One of the most important musical voices in the history of jazz was Michael Brecker, an Ashkenazi Jew. The world lost Brecker 10 years ago much too early, at the age of 57. During his lifetime, he was the leading voice playing tenor saxophone, creating and leading bands, composing innovative music, and recording and performing on thousands of occasions. He was a musical revolutionary and icon. Since his passing, his recordings continue to be heard by students of jazz and by jazz fans. But his music is largely absent from the concert and club stages, because it is technically very challenging.

The lecture explains Michael's remarkable personal history (featuring a slide show of more than 100 photographs from all stages of his life) and explains the special qualities of his compositions and the unique features of his playing.

Following the lecture is lunch, followed by a Jazz Concert by the quartet, Charged Particles.
